Additional Activity Bus

Beginning Tuesday 12th September we will be running an additional bus route at 5:05pm. The bus will run an abbreviated route to the Intermodal Hub (250 South, 600 West) returning through the Glendale and Rose Park neighborhoods. If your student chooses to ride the second bus, they will need to be enrolled in the After School Program and complete a Bus Registration form.

After School Programming

Our after school program will take place Mondays through Thursdays until 5pm and Fridays until 3pm beginning September 12. The After School bus operates an abbreviated route departing at 5:05pm from SLCSE Monday through Thursday.

Due to budget cuts, we have been forced to reduce after school offerings this year.

Homework Hall: Supervised by a SLCSE teacher and tutors from the University of Utah, students can receive help on homework and a quiet place to study every day of the week.

SAA: Students meet weekly to plan and implement service projects within our community. Facilitated by Ms. Powell and SLCSE alumni.

Bike Shop: Students in Mr. Eaton's Bike Shop class are required to complete service hours after school on Wednesday running the SLCSE Community Bike Shop. Others interested in bike maintenance are welcome to participate.

Mondays with Ms. Benedict: A hands on, interactive, student driven group that meets on Mondays to create costumes for Comic Con, write ghost stories, participate in craft projects, and generally have fun.

Maker Space: Can't get enough time with Mr. Hamilton and the laser cutter, then come join other creative students on Friday afternoons?

MESA: The purpose of MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement) is to increase the number of ethnic minority and all

female students who pursue coursework, advanced study and possible careers in mathematics, engineering, and science areas. Students in MESA attend field trips and after-school meetings in Ms. Chandlers room that consist of fun educational activities, competitions, and industry and academic guest speakers.

AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

SLCSE welcomes every student to participate in after school activities. We are unable to provide supervision for students not enrolled in the afterschool program so please make arrangements for your student to leave school at 3:30pm. The cost of the program is \$60/ per family. Students may participate in more than one activity on as many days as you choose.

Activities will start Monday September 12th.

If your student will only be attending Homework Hall there is a \$10 registration fee per student.

Students must sign in/out each day. Students can walk home or wait to be picked up; the building will be locked at 5:15 pm. **MathCounts**: Open to any student in grades 6 through 8 who enjoy doing math for fun. Meets every other week with Ms. Crim.

Mountain Bike Team: For all high school students interested in joining the bike team. During the season, students practice after school two days a week.

SLCSE SCOOP: Student written newspaper meets weekly. Supervised by SLCSE parents.

Archery Team Practice: December and January (two days/week) with Mr. Szugye.

Basketball Intermurals: Come to the gym and play some ball.

Computer Lab: The computer lab will be open from 7:30-8:30 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.

We also want to inform you that parents and guardians have the right to request specifics about the qualifications of their child's teachers. If your child's teacher is not considered Highly Qualified, we will notify you.

Parents will be involved in making school decisions, writing school plans, and assessing the effectiveness of school programs.

Our school has a variety of formal ways to develop the home/school partnership such as Back to School Night, Parent-Teacher Conferences, School Community Council (SCC), Family Math and Literacy Nights, Parent Teacher Association (PTA), school newsletters, and other such opportunities. 
