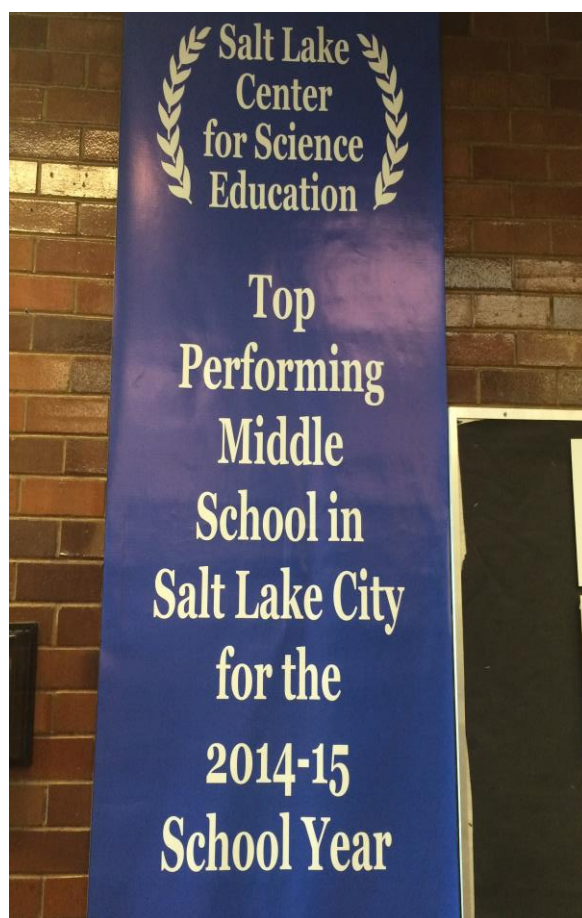

Application Period for SLCSE is open

We are will be accepting applications for the academic school year 2016-2017 beginning December 1st so **please spread the word!** We will be holding an Open House for prospective students and families on January 14th from 5 until 7pm.

If you are a current student: You do not need to reapply. Letters of Intent to Re-enroll will be sent to all current 8th and 9th graders in **late February**.

If you are a current student and you have a sibling who is planning on attending SLCSE next year: They must complete an application. According to our charter we may give preference to siblings only if they apply during the open enrollment period.

Spring 2016 Computer Programming I (CSIS1400)

This class will be offered after school to juniors and seniors starting the second week in January. The one time registration fee for SLCC is \$40 and the class fee is \$5 per credit for 4 credits, \$20. The total cost of this college course is \$60. These credits can be used for high school CTE credit or Applied Math credit. The class will be held here at SLCSE on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30-5:30pm. The class will end around the second week of May 2016.

Biotechnology (BTEC1010 and BTEC1015)

Biotechnology will be offered in 2016-17 school year as a concurrent class with SLCC. This class will be for juniors and seniors interested in pursuing a career in medical lab technology, medicine, laboratory science, etc. The one time registration fee for SLCC is \$40 and the class fee is \$5 per credit for 4 credits, \$20. The total cost of this college course is \$60. This class is a full year class and the credits can be used for CTE or an elective science credit. If you are already registered at SLCC, you will not have to pay the \$40 fee registration fee. Students that take this class as a junior will have the option of taking a biotechnology internship class at SLCC their senior year and receive college and high school credit.

Drivers Education this Spring at SLCSE

Drivers Education will be offered after school in the spring of 2016 here on the SLCSE campus. It will be offered in an accelerated format over a 3 week period. The class will be after school and on Saturdays. The fee will be \$120. More information to come as the dates and times are determined.

Hands-On Science Program Comes to Utah

The Perry Initiative will be holding an exciting, one-day program at the University of Utah. The event, hosted and sponsored by the Department of Orthopaedics, aims to get young women interested in pursuing careers in orthopaedic surgery and engineering. Women currently comprise only 7% of the surgeon and engineer workforce in orthopaedics. The event organizers believe that early exposure to these exciting, hands-on careers is key to boosting diversity and introducing fresh eyes and new perspectives to these life-changing fields.

We encourage young women from local high schools to apply for this exciting, one-day long program. The program is completely free of cost and the application is only a short, two-question essay.

The selected students will perform surgical simulations to correct scoliosis deformity, fix a broken leg, and repair a rotator cuff. Throughout the day, they will learn from prominent women surgeons, engineers, and business women in the field of orthopaedics.

The Perry Initiative is a non-profit organization that holds outreach programs nationwide. This is the 1st annual event at the University of Utah.
