

Course description

This course will be an absolute beginner's course to introduce the basic concepts of computer programming. The Java programming language will be used as an introductory language because it is easy to write, and Java is "platform-independent"

Java is also the backbone of games like Minecraft. By the end of this course, students will be able to make their own Minecraft server mods by learning concepts such as API utilization and object-oriented programming.
