Dear Parents and Guardians,

Beginning today, Salt Lake City School District will be administering school climate surveys for our school. The purpose is to gather stakeholder input about teachers, principals, and schools. All parents/ guardians and all students will be invited to participate. Responses are anonymous and no personal information will be collected. Results will be shared with teachers and administrators in order to help improve schools. The survey is short, taking less than 10 minutes to complete. The survey can be taken through the Parent Portal of PowerSchool by clicking the "Parent Course Survey" link at the bottom left hand side of screen after your login. If you do not have a computer, computers are available at the public library and in the SLCSE casa. The survey can also be taken on any internet connected device. The survey is available in English, Spanish, Somali, Tongan, and Bosnian.

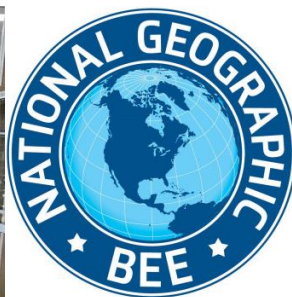
