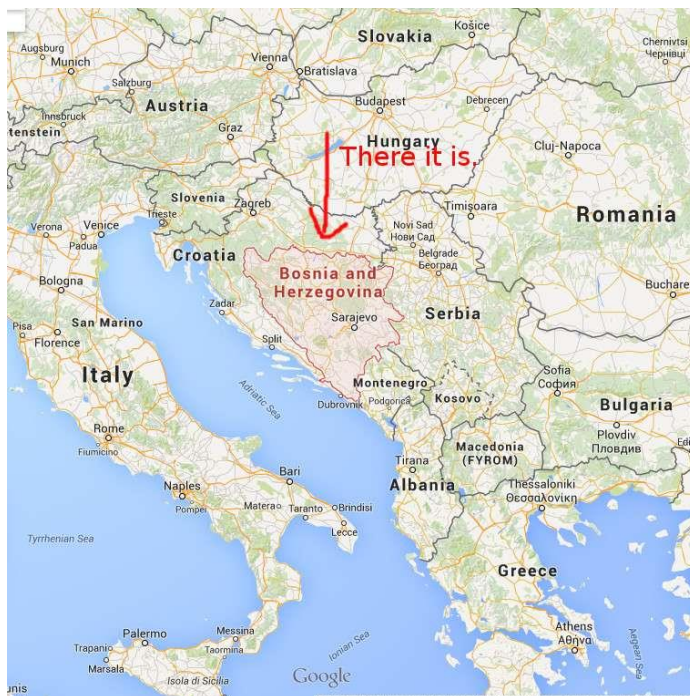

Want to see the World? Have the World Come to You!

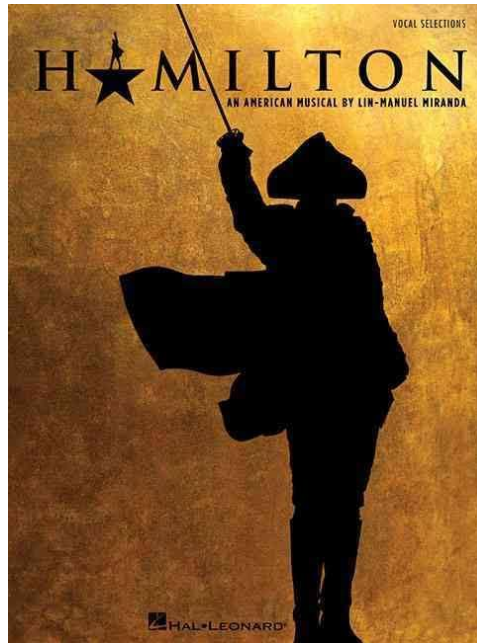
