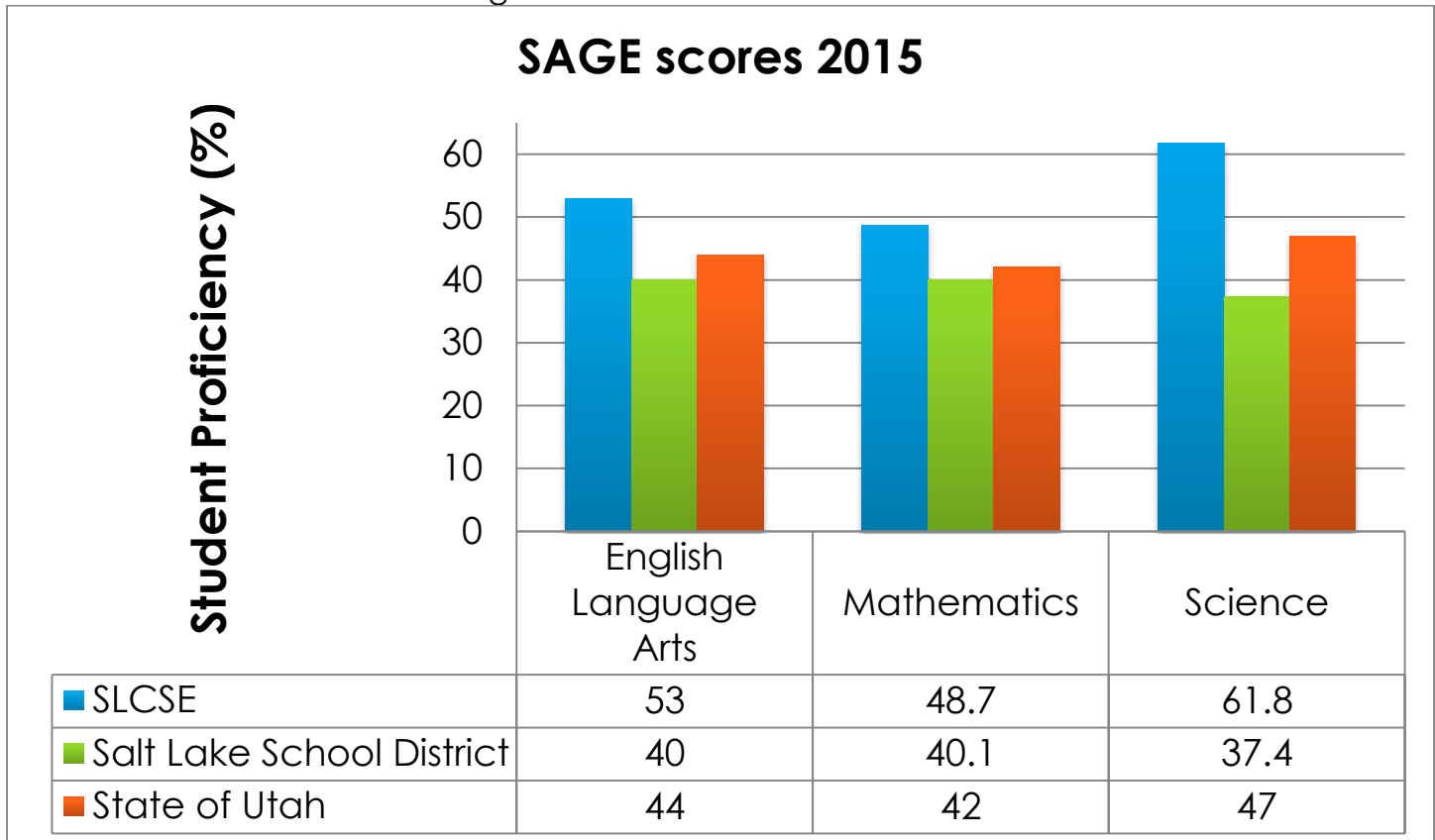
Hawkwatch

Hawkwatch is an organization whose mission is to monitor the migration of raptors and educate the public about raptor conservation. After a grueling hike, students were able to learn about how field biologists capture and count the birds as they fly south over the Goshute Mountains. Homework Hall

If you see that your student is struggling with specific classes, consider signing them up for Homework hall. We have two to three tutors each day to help students with homework, editing essays and preparing for the ACT.

How do I sign up? Simply ask for a registration form in the front office.

Is there a cost? Free tutoring and a snack will cost you \$10 for each student for the entire year.

Does my student have to go to Homework hall every day?

No, they can choose which days they attend. We are open 3:30 until 5pm Monday through Thursday and 1:30 until 3pm on Friday. We expect your student to arrive in homework hall and sign in within the first ten minutes of the start. Students who leave homework hall cannot re-enter at a later time.

Can my student do their homework and then leave to participate in Physical Activity with Mr. Szugye? Absolutely, provided they are not falling behind on homework.
