The **Daniels Scholarship Program** is a four-year annually-renewable college scholarship for graduating high school seniors who demonstrate exceptional character, leadership, and a commitment to serving their communities.

Every year, Daniels Scholars are selected from our four-state region of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming. Daniels Scholars currently attend more than 200 colleges and universities in 44 states.

As of June 2015, the Daniels Scholarship Program has provided nearly **\$130 million in undergraduate scholarships to more than 3,250 students.**

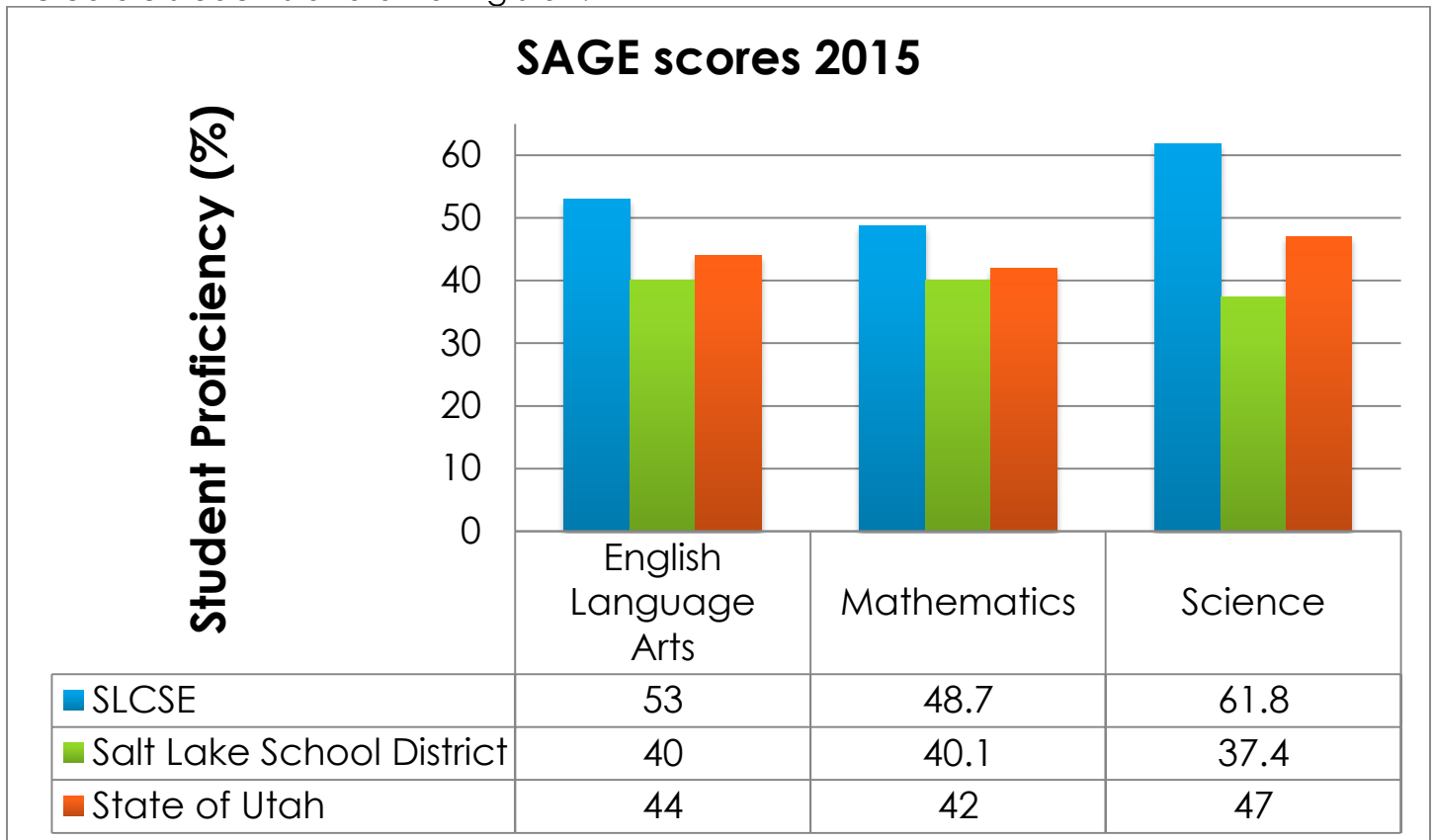
